



WHAT DOES AGENDA 2030 MEAN FOR YOU?



HOW YOUR LIFE WILL CHANGE IN ORDER TO MEET NET ZERO



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This short booklet will briefly explain the plans for the next few years, and help prepare you for the changes that need to be made to meet our 17 Sustainable Development Goals and the UN/WEF Agenda for humanity in the 21st Century.

All national governments and local councils have signed up to implement our plan, and we have total support across all major media outlets and social media platforms.



1 ENERGY



Powering your home and fuelling your car will become more challenging as we seek to remove fossil fuel supply and reduce total energy use. Countries will rely exclusively on subsidised solar, wind and other non-traditional sources.

To reduce energy use and save the Earth, most independent businesses, including farms, will have to close, and the end of private transport for almost everybody will happen by 2050 at the latest.

All properties will be required to meet increasing energy performance standards, and have a smart meter for full real-time monitoring and energy control by 2030.



2 TRANSPORT



Governments will continue raising road and fuel duties, and insurance companies will keep raising premiums to meet carbon targets.

As a result, many will be forced to use public transport, lift-share/Uber-type services or bicycles. Road networks and traffic will be severely disrupted during this time, helping to nudge human behaviour towards the Sustainable Development Goals of Agenda 2030.

Holidays abroad will soon be scarce, with flight travel limited to official government and business trips.

3 FOOD



Natural farming, particularly that involving animals, creates global warming (source: IPCC, WEF, Bill Gates et al.), which is why farmers are being encouraged to either repurpose their land for uses other than food, rewild it, or leave farming and their land completely, using government grants.

The food supply chain has been conglomerated, so that now just a handful of large, select companies control most of what is produced, transported and sold across the world. This gives us a unique opportunity to change human eating habits permanently.

There will be almost no natural meat produced by 2040, and much more of your diet will come from renewable, artificial sources, which will be much better for the environment overall.



4 ENVIRONMENT



To meet energy needs and reduce farming still further, much more of the countryside will be given over to solar installations, wind turbine arrays, battery stations and other infrastructure needed to propel the renewable revolution over the next 10 to 20 years.

We need to reduce and control energy use for all western countries, on both an individual and city-region scale. By 2030, all power will be routed via the electricity grid, and thus both the population and their energy consumption will be maintained in perpetual balance with nature.

5 GOVERNANCE



With corruption, scandal and incompetence a very evident part of how governments and local councils are run, a direct mayor scheme has been instigated across the world (C40 cities) in order to more directly and transparently implement Agenda 2030 in every region.

National governments (together with their binding constitutions) will soon be a thing of the past, as the push for devolution will mean that decisions are made locally for the people.

Many cities such as London, Manchester and Leeds already have a directly elected mayor who wields immense power due to huge grants.



6 DIGITAL



Have you noticed that banks, shops, pubs and restaurants are closing, and high streets are like ghost towns, aside from the busiest periods?

This accelerated in 2020, as much more human activity was moved online where everything can be monitored, controlled and, most importantly, carbon-restricted, to save the Earth. There will be many more 5G/6G towers everywhere.

Automation will also take over a large percentage of human employment as a part of the 'Fourth Industrial Revolution'.

Online censorship will increase, and the inevitable fallout from mass unemployment and widespread poverty will have to be managed, but the primary concern is always to preserve nature as much as possible.



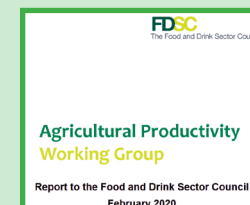
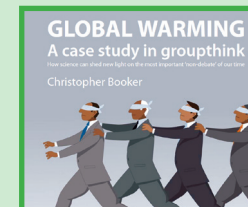
7 CONTROL



To facilitate a digitally compliant world, the only accepted payment method will be a digital currency. Known as CBDC, it will be a significant step on from the convenience of using a card or your phone to pay now.

Your money will be directly provided by the central bank, and will be fully programmable. This means we will be able to encourage people to spend if the economy slows down, or to save if there is a surplus. We can control and restrict where your money can be spent (for example, in the event of another pandemic), how it can be spent (to move you to more sustainable choices) and when it can be spent (giving money an expiry date will enable us to manage individual carbon usage).
